General Order Title: <b>DIGNITARY SECURITY</b>		

### POLICY

This policy establishes guidelines and procedures to ensure the safety and protection of dignitaries in the City of Reno.

### PROCEDURES

When security is needed for dignitaries, the Chief of Police will designate a security team supervisor. The supervisor will assign tasks including, but not limited to, the following provisions:

- Designation of a single person or position as supervisor and coordinator of a given security detail;
- Equipment requirements, to include consideration of vehicles, body armor for VIP's and security officers, and weapons for officers;
- Planning and reconnoitering of travel routes, sites, and facilities;
- Arrangements for gathering intelligence information;
- Coordination of operations with outside agencies;
- Identification of emergency first aid, ambulance, and medical facilities; and
- Communications equipment and procedures.
