- Complete seven 4-hour Training Patrols with a SAVE Patrol Training Officer
- Attend a training session at the City Hall Information Desk
- Attend a 1-hour Training Meeting Each Month

- Patrolling Shopping Centers
- Reno City Hall Information Desk

- Participation in Reno Special Events such as Street Vibrations
- Vacation House Checks
- Patrolling Parks and Schools

What Is S.A.V.E.

- SAVE is a Volunteer Organization of the Reno Police Department
- SAVE Officers Relieve Reno Police Officers of Low-Risk Duties, Allowing the RPD Officers More Time for Crime Prevention
- SAVE was Organized in 1997
- SAVE has about 90 Active Volunteer Officers on Duty
- SAVE Officers Conduct Car Patrols Within the City of Reno
- SAVE Officers are Provided With a Badge and Uniform
- SAVE Performs Non-Confrontational Duties



Qualifications To Join S.A.V.E.

- 50 Years of Age or Older
- Ability to Communicate in a Non-Confrontational Manner
- Possession of a Valid Nevada Identification Card or Driver's License
- Considered to be in Good Health
- Willingness to Provide 16 Hours per Month of Service
- Ability to find own transportation to and from the SAVE office
- Complete a Criminal Background Check
