OUR HISTORY

In 1998, the Victim Services unit was established at the Reno Police Department to provide services to victims of violent crime. The unit has grown to consist of eight professional team members with many years of advocacy experience. There is a Supervisor, five Victim Advocates, two of which are bilingual in Spanish, one part-time Victim Advocate, Volunteer Outreach Coordinator, Public Service Intern and vital administrative staff. Our staff has extensive training and education and provides a tremendous amount of volunteer hours to the community.

In addition to serving the needs of crime victims, the staff participates in various projects and committees in an effort to encourage greater consistency between the criminal and civil justice systems, community, agencies, and victim services.

The Victim Services Unit continuously strives for the highest standard of ethics, service, professionalism, and available resource for victims.
